V-ZUG is the leading Swiss manufacturer of premium kitchen and laundry appliances based – as the name indicates – in Zug. More than 100 years ago the company committed itself to making everyday life easier with high-quality, innovative house-hold appliances. Of course, the same principle should apply to the printing solutions at V-ZUG's in-house print shop. As Ricoh already had a presence at V-ZUG with its office printers it was commissioned to optimise the processes in production printing.

### **Underlying Holistic Approach**

The challenge facing V-ZUG was to achieve an optimum distribution of internal and external print jobs, with the aim of maximising the efficiency and quality of its printing processes and minimising costs. Ricoh advised V-ZUG on this issue and put measures in place to achieve these goals. To get an impression of the current processes at V-ZUG, Ricoh first of all carried out a basic analysis. This focused on answering questions such as "What are the internal processes from planning to the finished print product and which departments are involved?" or "Which products are produced internally, which ones externally and for what reason?" The next step was to draw the right conclusions from the data collected and to optimise the printing solutions.

#### From Out-of-House to In-House

One core area that emerged from the analysis was the option of moving external print volumes back in house. Ricoh put forward specific suggestions about which production machines were best suited for this move, and on the possible options to expand the range of services. For the production of black and white transactional documents, V-ZUG ultimately chose a Ricoh Pro 8210. This model offers excellent reproduction capabilities, features highly accurate duplex registration and a high resolution. The Ricoh Pro C5210S was the first choice for the production of high-quality print products. As additional options, a Plockmatic booklet-making machine including a backing press and front-cutting unit were integrated into this production printer. This puts V-ZUG in a position to print entire brochures and process them to a finished product, something that in the past would have to have been outsourced to an external service provider.
